1 INTER-COUNTIES TRACK AND FIELD CHAMPIONSHIPS.

The Championships were once again staged at Bedford. The Men were 8th overall with 31 points and the Women 5th with 48 points. Three athletes won their event: Tom Parsons did 2.27 in the High Jump, Emma Williams 55.46 in the 400m and Ese Okoro 59.76 in the 400H. Second places were gained by Ann Wheeler in the 3,000 Walk 16.45 and Sineade Gutzmore in the Triple Jump, 13.00.

Thanks are due once again to Becky Freeman for contacting and cajoling athletes into competing and as Team Manager at Bedford.

As a result of his performance and others, Tom was chosen to represent Great Britain and NI in the European Cup, but unfortunately had to withdraw due to injury.

5 COUNTY CHAMPIONSHIPS 2011

The Track and Field Championships were held at The Pingles Stadium Nuneaton. We would like to thank the Staff at the centre for their help before and during the Championships which helped to make the proceedings run smoothly.

The Warwick Vase for the club gaining most points in the Championship was retained by Birchfield Harriers with 613, from Rugby and Northampton 467 and Coventry Godiva Harriers 451.

The Coronation Cup for the winner of the senior Men's 1500m was won for the first time by Nicholas Lyster of Godiva. The Jack Hartley Trophy for the best individual performance is awarded to Rowena Cole of Coventry Godiva Harriers for her performance in the 800m (2.06.8).

For the first time your committee decided to recognize the top performances by individuals in each age group. It is a tribute to the quality of performances in some age groups that we drank 2 cups of coffee whilst debating the winners. The most difficult was in the U17 Girls; where of the 6 names put forward, 5 were ranked in the top 10 nationally.

U13G Isobel Davis of Leamington C&AC for her 1500m in 5.07.5, a new County record.

U15G Georgina Rogers of Birchfield Harriers for her 300m in a new County record of 41.5.

U17G Joint winners, Katie Staiton of Birchfield Harriers (300m hurdles in 44.5) and Kerry Murch of Rugby and Northampton (new County Javelin record of 39.31).

U20W Melissa Hanson of Birchfield Harriers for her 200m in 24.9.

SenW Rowena Cole of Coventry Godiva Harriers for her performance in the 800m (2.06.8).

MasWom Julie Rogers of Birchfield Harriers for her 400m hurdles in 70.6.

U13B Jordan Lloyd of Birchfield Harriers for his 200m in 27.3.

U15B Jordan Broome of Coventry Godiva Harriers for his 200m in 23.9.

U17M Nick Wilson of Solihull and Small Heath AC for the 100m hurdles in 13.7.

U20M Jose Martin-Fullerton of Birchfield Harriers for breaking his own County record with a jump of 14.87.

SenMen Jordan McGrath of Birchfield Harriers for his 400m in a time of 47.8.

MasMen Rob Andrew of Bournville Harriers for his endurance double which set two new County records (800m in 2.04.3 and 1500m in 4.13.0). (3 Jordan's!).

6 British Masters Championships

Congratulations to all medalists at the Championships held at the revamped Alexander Stadium, particularly the double gold medalists: Ellena Ruddock 100/200m and 2 Championship best performances, Rob Andrew 800/1500m, Ann Wheeler and Keith Richards 3,000 and 5,000m walks. Brian Darby set a CBP in winning his 400m and was second in the 200m, Monica Williamson 1st 1,500 2nd 800. Kevin Murch also set a CBP in winning the Javelin

7 English Schools Track and Field Championships, Gateshead

Sian Rainsley was the only County winner with a p b in the Junior Girls 1,500 of 4.35.02. Ebony Wake was 2nd in the JG long jump with 5.59. The equal winners of the U17 girl's plaques at the County Championships, Katie Stainton and Kerry Murch, landed bronze medals in the IG 300H and Javelin respectively.
